Marina Island – Established on the coast of Teluk Muroh in Perak, Malaysia. A gateway to Pangkor Island and Pangkor Laut.

Floating Mosque (Sightseeing) – Beautiful architecture of floating mosque on Pangkor island in Malaysia. Beautiful sacral building in south east Asia.

Fu Lin Kong Temple – It is the largest Taoist temple on the island. There are a number of Chinese inhabitants on Pangkor who adhere to the Taoist doctrine.

Lin Je Kong Temple – Chinese temple called the Lin Je Kong which literally means kind spirit temple. One unique feature of this temple is that it is situated on the seaside.

Mangrove Swamp Park – The local called it "Taman Paya Bakau", though the swamps are muddy in nature, they help to provide an eco-system that supports a variety of living organisms and plants.

Tua Pek Kong Temple – It is thought to be over 100 years old but has undergone rapid changes in recent years, with the addition of more statues, a dragon tunnel, surrounding walls and a pagoda.

Sitiawan Settlement Museum – It was converted into a museum on 7th September, 2003. It is fully-funded and managed by the Methodist Church.

Leaning Clock Tower (Sightseeing) – One of the main attractions of Teluk Intan is the Leaning Clock Tower. It also acts as a reservoir to supply water to the residents and also acts as a clock tower.

Hock Soon Keong Temple – Hock Soon Temple was the center point of all Hokkien Chinese in Teluk Intan during the British colonial era.
